Happy New Year!

Today is a good day to reflect on the past and ponder the future. For me, what stands out from Prostate Cancer Support Regina 2023 activities, is meeting again in-person. The May hybrid in-person and on-line Zoom support meeting was the first face-to-face gathering since March 2000. At the hybrid in-person and on-line Zoom June AGM, members elected a new Board of Directors. At its first meeting, the Board elected an executive and made strategic planning its first priority. In Fall 2023, Vice-Chair Troy Hagen lead the Board of Directors in a strategic planning process over three meetings. The Board collaboratively produced a one-page 2023-2026 Strategic Map containing a vision, mission, values, goals, objectives and measurement to guide and govern the organization for the next three years.

With the publishing of the Strategic Plan, members will notice the newsletter changed to reflect four NEW Board Committees. Past committees are replaced by new Board Committees that are responsible to plan, prioritize and implement activities to deliver on PCS Regina's mission. The Board's Executive forms the Governance/Finance Committee. It has met and taken up the task of implementing the new governance model and plan. The Governance/Finance Committee's responsibilities include communication of the strategic plan to members and stakeholders. An important future activity planned for Fall 2024 is engaging members and stakeholders to improve and strengthen the Strategic Plan by consulting on our collective experience of its first year of implementation.

Prostate Cancer Support Regina is pleased to announce that Victor Vivar Kessels, a 4th year student completing a Bachelor of Pharmaceutical Sciences at UBC. Victor will be presenting information on the most commonly-used medications for prostate cancer.

Medications such as hormone and chemo therapy agents will be discussed.

During this break, we encourage partner and one-on-one support chats. The final 60 minutes of the meeting will be Victor's presentation on commonly used medications for prostate cancer.





What are "Clinical Trials?"

According to the Sask Cancer Agency, a clinical trial is a study used to develop better ways to prevent, detect or treat cancer. Clinical trials test different types of treatment: new drugs, new approaches to surgery or radiation therapy, or new combinations of treatment. When the method of treatment has been found to be safe it can then be offered to the public. Cancer treatments that are used today were developed and tested first as a clinical trial.

Clinical trials give cancer patients access to the newest types of treatment. By taking part in a clinical trial you may benefit from a new treatment which may prove to be as effective or more effective than the standard treatment available for your type of cancer at this time.

Enrolment in a clinical trial is voluntary and is usually done before the start of treatment. Before enrolling you will be provided with information about the trial and the treatment, tests, potential benefits and side effects.

Clinical trials follow very strict ethical guidelines which protect patients' health, safety and privacy. Clinical trials must be approved by Health Canada, the hospital or clinic where the study will take place and its Research Ethics Board. If you are interested in being part of a clinical trial, talk to your physician. They will assist you in finding out if you are eligible to enter a specific trial depending on the type of cancer you have, your age and other factors.


